DURING ONE WEEK in January 2012, three different customers came into Zweed's store and said the same thing: "I love the Peep design, but I want more drawers. I need more storage space for my clothes." So I decided to make a Peep cabinet that would meet their needs – a chest of drawers.

The Peep B1 was launched in March, and the first 25 pieces sold out rapidly – evidence that listening to your customers is an excellent source of product development.

ZWEED'S STUDIO doubles as a store, and talking to customers always provides valuable input. I also invite customers to discuss prototypes and ideas, and to take part in the design process. This makes it easier for me to answer the crucial question: Should this particular piece be taken into production or not? I also try

to learn as much as I can from Zweed's resellers. And I like to hang out in the cabinetmaker's workshop, asking too many questions, just to get my head around what's doable and what's not.

I'm well aware that the first question customers ask is usually: "How much is it?" closely followed by: "What's the delivery time?" But other kinds of questions pop up, too. Malmö hot spot


If you happen to be in Malmö and crave a well-cooked, delicious dinner in a chilled out,
